




City of Chicago Climate Infrastructure Fund ****

Program Description

As part of the Department of Planning and Development's ongoing efforts under the Chicago Recovery Plan, the Climate Infrastructure Fund (the Fund) provides grants from \$50,000 to \$250,000 to nonprofit organizations and small businesses for climate-related capital projects in three priority areas:






Equitable Decarbonization in Buildings




Chicago's built environment represents the largest portion of our emissions profile.






Community Tree Equity

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

During dry periods, the tree may need watering every three days. Cost for watering is minimal to the resident (around \$6 per year, \$3 for seniors). Please do not remove the wood mulch from around the base of the tree. The mulch was placed there to keep the roots cool and moist in the summer, and to protect the tree from cold in the winter. And like any good neighbor, please look out for the new tree. Protect it from vandalism, lawn mowers, weed whips and vehicles. 
- Efficiencies in Planting Requests
